He worked union corruption and related organized crime cases in Florida and later transferred to Los Angeles where he began investigating identity theft cases tied to the Mexican Mafia. He also sat on a joint task force investigating Asian organized crime and human trafficking.

Long holds a B.A., magna cum laude, from Howard University. He also was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He earned his J.D. from the University of Pennsylvania Law School. He is a member of the State Bar of Georgia. Upon graduating from law school, he served as law clerk to Judge Clifford Scott Green of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Philadelphia.

Long currently teaches a variety of criminal justice and legal studies courses at Brandman University, part of the Chapman University system, where he is the program director for both the criminal justice and legal studies programs.
