Leigh Maddox retired a Captain from the Maryland State Police in 2007. In the 1990s, she worked as a patrol trooper and supervisor; served in the Intelligence Division including a long term undercover assignment in which she infiltrated the Ku Klux Klan; and worked as a criminal investigator, legislative coordinator, public affairs spokesperson, and academy Instructor.

Leigh later served as the Commander of the Baltimore Washington Metro Troop, Planning and Research Division, Training Division, and as the coordinator for the racial profiling Consent Decree related to the drug interdiction policies of the Maryland State Police.

Leigh now serves as a Visiting Assistant Professor at the University of Maryland School of Law and is cross designated as a Special Assistant State's Attorney for Baltimore City. She earned her B.S. from John Hopkins University and her J.D. from the University of Maryland, School of Law.
