Peter Moskos was a Baltimore City Police Officer assigned to patrol on the midnight shift in the high-crime Eastern District, an area known to many from the HBO series *The Wire*.

Moskos left the police force to return to his graduate studies in sociology. He received his B.A. from Princeton University (1994) and his Ph.D. from Harvard University (2004). He's currently a professor of Law and Police Science at John Jay College of Criminal Justice in New York City.

He is the author of the award winning and critically acclaimed *Cop in the Hood*, published by Princeton University Press. Moskos argues that the War on Drugs has created a new policing paradigm. His current research focuses on police, crime prevention, and public policies that succeed at improving quality of life and saving lives.
