From 1974 to 1979, Ken Abraham was a deputy attorney general for Delaware with statewide authority and jurisdiction to prosecute all criminal cases. He is a veteran of more than 400 jury and 200 non-jury trials and has handled thousands of cases in every State Court in Delaware.

Later on, as a defense attorney, he represented the first person in the state to be prosecuted under a drug law requiring a mandatory minimum sentence.

Having recovered from addiction while attending hundreds of NA/AA meetings and conducting extensive research about addiction and related behavioral problems, Abraham understands punitive drug laws and incarceration only make addiction more difficult and deadly.

Ken Abraham is a graduate of the Penn State Dickinson School of Law and Kenyon College. After retiring, he founded a nonprofit called Citizens for Criminal JUSTICE, which runs an Adopt a Prisoner church reentry program and seeks to address the myriad of problems plaguing the criminal justice system. He currently lives in Dover, Delaware.
