Leigh Maddox retired as a Captain from the Maryland State Police in 2007. In the 1990s, she worked as a patrol trooper and supervisor; serving in the Intelligence Division. Maddox worked long-term undercover assignments and infiltrated criminal organizations, including the Klu Klux Klan. She later served as the Commander of the Baltimore Washington Metro Troop's Planning and Research Division, Training Division, and as the coordinator for the racial profiling Consent Decree related to the drug interdiction policies of the Maryland State Police.

Maddox also has experience as a criminal investigator, legislative coordinator, public affairs spokesperson, and academy instructor.

Formerly a Professor at the University of Maryland School of Law, Maddox was cross designated as a Special Assistant State's Attorney for Baltimore City. She earned her B.S. from John Hopkins University and her J.D. from the University of Maryland, School of Law. Maddox currently works in private practice.
