In the S.D.P.D, Stamper rose quickly through the ranks and as deputy chief served in each of the department's bureaus. Norm earned his Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Criminal Justice Administration from San Diego State University and his Ph.D. in Leadership and Human Behavior from United States International University. He is a graduate of the F.B.I.'s National Executive Institute.

Over the past three decades, he has conducted organizational effectiveness and leadership training and consulting for both public and private organizations throughout North America. He is the author of *Breaking Rank: A Top Cop's Expose of the Dark Side of American Policing*, and most recently, *To Protect and Serve: How to Fix America's Police*.
