Richard Van Wickler began his law enforcement career in 1987 and has been the Superintendent of the Cheshire County Department of Corrections in Keene, New Hampshire, since June of 1993. Van Wickler is a former adjunct professor of American Corrections at Keene State College, where he taught for 14 years.

Van Wickler spent 26 years in the U.S. Army and retired in 2006. He was a senior instructor for Army R.O.T.C. at the University of New Hampshire and retired as a Course Manager for the New Hampshire Military Academy.

He has participated in discussions about international drug policy reform at the United Nations and has testified before the House and Senate of New Hampshire on several occasions.

Van Wickler holds a B.S. in Management from Franklin Pierce University and is a co-recipient of the President's Community Partner Award from Antioch University Graduate School. He was selected as Correctional Superintendent of the Year in 1997 and 2011. He received New Hampshire's Profile Service Award for his many contributions to County Government in 2009. Van Wickler also sits on the board of the New Hampshire chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union.
