

Officer Teri Moore (Fmr.) Los Angeles Police Department & U.S Army Sarasota, FL

Teri Moore is a former Police Officer, Drug Recognition Expert Instructor, and Former First Lieutenant with the U.S. Army Military Police.

Moore began her law enforcement career in the Army, where she was a military police officer for four years and rose through the ranks to First Lieutenant.

Upon leaving the Army, Moore joined the Los Angeles Police Department as a patrol officer in high-crime neighborhoods. She later became a Drug Recognition Expert and a D.R.E. Instructor at the L.A.P.D. school, where she trained law enforcement officials from across the country on how to recognize impairment from alcohol and other drugs. She was a court-qualified expert in marijuana, cocaine, heroin, P.C.P., and methamphetamine impairment. Moore was subsequently assigned to South Bureau Narcotics, where she became familiar with confidential informants, search warrants, and asset forfeiture. At South Bureau Narcotics, she was involved in forfeiture cases that included seizure of cars, recording studios, and one bust that yielded 300 kilograms of heroin and cocaine.

After five years with the L.A.P.D., Moore became an editor for Reason Magazine. She has worked with Reason Magazine for thirteen years and currently resides in Sarasota, Florida.
