Officer Stephen Bradley (Fmr.) Atlanta, GA

Stephen Bradley is a former police officer and patrol sergeant for a large full-service sheriff's office in the Atlanta metro area. After 10 years as both a line deputy and supervisor, Stephen began to see the same faces filling the jail and courthouse day after day, which inspired him to advocate for better public safety policies.

As a deputy on the road, Bradley worked as a general patrol officer, a field training officer, and, later, as part of a small uniformed "anti-crime" team tasked with patrolling higher crime areas and locating drugs through routine traffic stops and roadside interdiction. Bradley quickly became known for his penchant for arresting drug users and dealers and received recognition several times as the department's Deputy of the Month. Stephen was also awarded the Sheriff's Medal of Valor following a violent pursuit and officer-involved shooting he was involved in. Bradley

accrued hundreds of training hours while on the road, including field sobriety, use of force, field training officer, Pursuit Intervention Technique (PIT) maneuver, active shooter, crisis intervention, extensive supervision training, and drug interdiction training through the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) federal task force.

After about seven years on the road, Stephen was promoted to the rank of Sergeant and was responsible for the direct supervision of 6-10 deputies assigned to the busiest precinct in the Sheriff's Office. After several years as a patrol supervisor, he transferred to the courthouse division, which is where he first started noticing that our drug policies are not what they appear to be.

After leaving law enforcement, Bradley started a company that helps patients discover marijuana-based solutions where conventional medicine has failed them.
