Anthony Ramos served for six years in the marines before beginning his law enforcement career in 1997 as a police officer in the Oakland Police Department. He worked every kind of case, from street narcotics to financial investigations, including fraud, embezzlement, and identity theft.

In 2005, Ramos transferred to the Indio Police Department in the Coachella Valley, where he served for three years as a Field Training Officer and Supervisor before returning to the Oakland Police

Department.

Ramos served in Patrol, Community Policing Unit I, the Criminal Investigative Division, Problem Solving Unit I, Tactical Enforcement Task Force II, and the Vice Charging Unit. As a Problem Solving Officer, he targeted issues ranging from prostitution and narcotics to jaywalking. As part of the Tactical Enforcement Task Force, he worked with homicide to locate witnesses and suspects of murder. He regularly participated in forums with the community in an effort to build trust with the police department.

Ramos retired from law enforcement in 2013. He has since worked in the private sector and manages his own security consulting firm in Brentwood, California, where he currently resides.
