Jiles Ship is a Commissioner of the New Jersey Police Training Commission and has spent over 25 years in law enforcement - as a police officer in Edison, New Jersey, an Emergency Response Team member, and an instructor at the Middlesex County Police Academy.

Ship was previously the Lieutenant and Administrator of Investigations in the Division of Criminal Justice at the State of New Jersey Office of the Attorney General. Ship also served as the Director of Public Safety for the City of Plainfield, New Jersey. As the Chief Executive officer of the Department of Public Safety, Ship oversaw the Police Division, Fire Division, the Office of Emergency Management and was responsible for 254 sworn personnel and 51 civilian employees.

Ship is a past president of the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives and has been recognized for his service and innovation in policing by multiple civic associations, the State of New Jersey, Congress, the Department of Justice. He holds a M.A. in Educational Administration and Supervision from Seton Hall University and a B.S. in Administration of Justice from Thomas Edison State University. Ship now teaches as an adjunct professor at Rutgers University's School of Criminal Justice.
