



Chief Daniel Meloy (Ret.) Colerain Township Police Department, Ohio Colerain Township, OH

Daniel Meloy began his law enforcement career in 1989 as an officer with the Colerain Township Police Department in Ohio. In 2007, he was appointed Chief of Police. He served as Chief until 2013, when he was appointed Director of Public Safety.

As Director, Meloy was charged with overseeing both the fire and police departments for Colerain Township. In an effort to combat the opioid crisis, he implemented mobile syringe exchanges to halt the

spread of infectious diseases. Additionally, he created the first Colerain Quick Response Team to serve as a first responder unit for narcotic-related medical emergencies, resulting in a 35% drop in overdoses in the first year.

In 2016, Meloy stepped down from his role as Director of Public Safety and became an administrator for Colerain Township. He is currently President at D.P.M. Innovation Consulting Cincinnati, where he consults on public safety and the heroin/opiate epidemic. He holds a B.S. in criminal justice and political science from the University of Cincinnati, a M.A. in public administration from Northern Kentucky University, and is a graduate of the F.B.I. National Academy.
