

Special Agent Jeffery Artis (Ret.) Federal Bureau of Investigation Jackson, MS

Special Agent Jeffery Artis (Ret.) began his law enforcement career in 1988 as a special agent for the Federal Bureau of Investigation (F.B.I.). He initially served in the Birmingham and Memphis Divisions of the F.B.I. before he transferred to the Jackson Division. His responsibilities included investigating organized crime, government fraud, narcotics, violent crimes, child pornography, public corruption, and civil rights violations. He subsequently worked as an Applicant Coordinator/Recruiter for

ten years and later served as the division's Crisis Negotiations Coordinator both domestically and internationally. He is a U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (E.E.O.C.) certified mediator and an expert in conflict resolution. He has trained local, state, federal, and international law enforcement agencies in crisis negotiations for over 20 years.

Artis retired from the F.B.I. in 2018 and currently manages a consulting firm. He's active in his local community and is a speaker for Empower Jackson Expel Crime Together (Project E.J.E.C.T.) and Legal Enrichment and Decision-making (L.E.A.D.). He holds a B.A. in political science from Miles College.
