## **Lt. Greg Mason (Ret.) Missouri Highway Patrol Lee's Summit, MO**

Lt. Greg Mason (Ret.) began his law enforcement career in 1979 as an officer with the Missouri Highway Patrol. For the first 19 years of his career, he served as a sergeant, corporal, and trooper. During this time, he investigated homicides as a member of the Metropolitan Major Case Squad. In 1998, he was promoted to lieutenant and was responsible for coordinating the federal Community Oriented Policing (COPS) Program. In 2003, he became the Assistant Director of the Human Resources Department, where his duties expanded to oversight and selection of all uniformed personnel. He retired from policing in 2008.

In addition to his law enforcement career, Mason has concurrently served in the Army National Guard and Missouri National Guard as a military academy instructor, lieutenant colonel, and brigadier general. He has been the recipient of the Legion of Merit Award, Missouri Highway Patrol Lifesaving Award, and Bronze Star Medal for Service in Iraq. He holds a BS in criminal justice from Missouri Western State University, a MA in public affairs and public management from Park University, a MA in strategic studies from the U.S. Army War College, and has attended the School of Police Staff and Command at Northwestern University.
