Officer Christopher Broome began his law enforcement career in 2007 with the Pascagoula Police Department in Mississippi. He was assigned as a special response team officer, field training officer, and served on a multi-agency task force focused on drug interdiction. In 2018, he became a Benton Legal Fellow with the city of Pascagoula where he researched administrative procedure. In 2019, he began work with the Mississippi Department of Public Safety, and his duties included publishing a quarterly review of cases from the Mississippi Court of

Appeals and state Supreme Court as well as advising state agencies on how to implement laws.

Officer Broome previously served as a squad leader in the US Marine Corps. He holds a BS in Aerospace Studies from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University and a MPA from the University of Louisiana Monroe.
