Detective David Doddridge (Ret.) began his law enforcement career in 1973 as an officer with the Los Angeles Police Department in California. He attained the position of detective and is an expert in police procedure, crisis intervention, narcotics investigations, no-knock raids, juvenile crimes, and sex crimes.

From 2003 to 2019, Doddridge was a private investigator registered in the State of Utah, where he specialized in criminal defense. He is a certified instructor in Positive Control Systems (PCS), a course

designed to enhance compliance without using force. He is also a court-certified Drug Recognition Expert.

Doddridge has received F.E.M.A. training in Terrorism, Nuclear Warfare, and Emergency Preparedness. He is a member of the National Association of Investigative Specialists (NAIS), Private Investigators Association of Utah (PIAU), Los Angeles Police Protective League (LAPPL), Chairman of Citizens Police Review Panel (St. George), and Police One.

Doddridge earned his B.A. in History with minors in Political Science and Speech from Brigham Young University in 1973. He did post-graduate work at U.C.L.A. and University of Wisconsin.
