## Assistant Chief Juan Cloy (Ret.) Canton Police Department Canton, MS

Assistant Chief Juan Cloy (Ret.) began his law enforcement career in 1995 as an officer with Jackson Police Department in Mississippi. He initially served in the Patrol Division where his duties focused on strengthening relationships with the local community and training officers as a certified field training officer. In 1998, he joined the Neighborhood Enforcement Team and was responsible for investigating drug crimes and conducting undercover operations. In 2000, he was elevated to a detective in the Major Crimes Unit and worked on homicide, aggravated assault, armed carjacking, theft, and property crimes. In 2001, he transferred to the Narcotics Division, where he conducted surveillance and undercover drug sting operations. In 2005, he became an assistant team lead with

the Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team and his responsibilities expanded to include confronting armed criminals, serving high-risk warrant service and arrests, hostage rescue, and conducting counter-terrorism operations. In 2007, he joined the Federal Bureau of Investigation as an undercover agent and participated in long-term assignments in Texas, Mississippi, and California. In 2012, he became Assistant Chief of the Canton Police Department in Mississippi where he supervised all operations of the department.

Assistant Chief Cloy retired from policing in 2015. He is currently the Lead Instructor at Justice Training Institute, which provides law enforcement with training on leadership, ethics, communication, juvenile delinquency, police conduct, leadership, and tactics. He is passionate about juvenile justice reform and has worked to improve positive interactions between police and students in addition to lowering suspension rates in Mississippi schools. He formerly served as both President and Vice President of the Jackson Police Officers Association. He holds a BS in criminal justice and correctional services as well as a MA in criminology and justice services from Jackson State University.
