Jake Lilly is an Assistant District Attorney, Iraq war veteran, and trial attorney based in Jefferson County, Colorado. During his time in the U.S. Army, Lilly was a member of the Judge Advocate Generals Corp and the 3rd Infantry Division based in Baghdad, Iraq. Lilly's roles in the Army included Trial Counsel, Military Magistrate, and Special Assistant U.S. Attorney. As Trial Counsel, he worked on assault, sexual battery, drug, child pornography, computer crimes, D.U.I., domestic violence, and desertion cases. As magistrate, his duties involved conducting pre-trial confinement hearings, evaluating search warrants, and reviewing investigations. Lilly also prosecuted crimes committed by civilians on military bases in the U.S. District Court

for the Southern District of Georgia as a Special Assistant U.S. Attorney.

Upon leaving the military, Lilly served as an Assistant District Attorney in the Eastern Judicial District of Georgia in Savannah. It was during this time that Lilly worked on one of the first DUI courts in the country specifically designed to address the root causes of DUI offenses. Lilly also worked on domestic violence, vehicular homicide, and misdemeanor traffic cases.

Lilly later served as an Assistant District Attorney for the Office of the Criminal District Attorney in Fort Worth, Texas. During this time, Lilly prosecuted misdemeanor and felony cases including aggravated robbery, aggravated assault, kidnapping, gun offenses, drugs, and animal abuse. In 2019, Lilly served as Deputy District Attorney with the Fifth Judicial District of Colorado, where he specialized in prosecution of sex crimes and child abuse.
