



Officer Gnatee Doe Daytona Beach Police Department Daytona, FL

Gnatee Doe began his law enforcement career in 2009 as an officer with the Daytona Beach Police Department in Florida. He served as a SWAT operator for seven years and his duties included responding to hostage situations and training officers in subjects such as hostage incident resolution, dignitary protection, firearms, and search warrants. He briefly worked undercover as a narcotics officer before transitioning to a training officer, where he oversaw the instruction of more than 200 officers in defensive tactics, patrol procedures, and de-escalation

techniques. He subsequently served as a field training officer, where he specialized in teaching community-relations, investigation procedures, and stress management to new recruits.

Doe currently serves as a school resource officer at Campbell Middle School, where he is responsible for security and mentoring students. He is an adjunct professor at Daytona College and teaches emergency services courses to EM. students. He holds a B.S. in criminal justice from Bethune Cookman University and a MFA in English and creative writing from Southern New Hampshire University.
