Captain Sonia Pruitt (Ret.) began her law enforcement career as an officer with the Montgomery County Police Department in Maryland. She served as the Deputy Director of The Internal Affairs Division and was later promoted to Administrative Lieutenant for the Office of the Chief of Police, where she helped to oversee the department's budget and staff. She has worked as a call taker for the police 911 dispatch center, an investigative sergeant, and a supervisor of the school resource officer program. In 2019, Pruitt was promoted to captain and concurrently served as a duty commander supervising calls for service county-wide.

Pruitt retired from policing in 2020. She is the past-president of the Coalition of Black Police Officers in Montgomery County, Maryland, and since 2018 has served as the Chairperson of the National Black Police Association. She holds a BS in criminal justice from the University of Maryland University College and an MA in forensic psychology from Argosy University. She is an adjunct professor of criminal justice administration at Montgomery College and teaches courses including Introduction to Policing, Criminal Investigation, and Police Organization and Administration.
