



Chief Todd Radford Lakeway Police Department, Texas Lakeway, TX

Chief Todd Radford began his 30-year law enforcement career with the Travis County Sheriff's Office in 1987, where he worked patrol, investigations, and field training assignments. He also served as a SWAT team member and training academy instructor and, later, as an instructor for the Law Enforcement Training Division at Texas A & M University. In 2005, he joined the Texas Attorney General's Office Special Investigations Division as the Training Director. He joined the Lakeway Police Department in 2007 as a Lieutenant and became Chief in 2009.

He has ensured officers are equipped with body cameras. He is responsible for making Lakeway the one of the first jurisdictions in Texas to train all officers as certified Mental Health Officers. His officers learned to effectively de-escalate tense situations, improving suspect safety and trust between the department and the community.

Chief Radford is a longtime adjunct instructor at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center in Washington, DC, and has trained law enforcement professionals at the local, state, and federal level. He holds a Bachelor's in Criminal Justice Administration and a MS in Strategic Leadership from Mountain State University.
