Officer Corey Williams began his law enforcement career in 2006 with the Lubbock Police Department in Texas. He initially worked in the Patrol Division, rode with the Bike Patrol Unit, and trained as a member of the Mobile Field Force. In 2009, he transferred to the Plainview Police Department as a patrol officer. He subsequently became a certified hostage negotiator through the International Association of Hostage Negotiators and worked with the Special Weapons And Tactics team. In 2013, he returned to Lubbock to serve with the Lubbock Cooper Independent School District Police Department and became a training sergeant and chaplain. During this time, he became an instructor for the Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training Center at Texas State University, where he specialized in Active Shooter Response. In 2017, Corey returned to the Lubbock Police Department and was assigned to the Field Services Bureau as a field training officer. He currently serves in the Investigative Services Bureau and investigates property crimes as a member of the Burglary Unit.

Officer Williams is certified with the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement as a master peace officer and instructor. Prior to his law enforcement career, he served as an emergency medical technician for six years.
