

Corrections Officer Sheri Ray (Fmr.) Indiana Department of Corrections Jeffersonville, IN

Corrections Officer Sheri Ray began her law enforcement career in 2000 with the North Carolina Department of Corrections in Raleigh. She supervised the Maximum Security Unit and served as a field training officer, the Lead Investigator of Security Threat Groups, and the Negotiations Lead for the Prison Emergency Response Team. In 2017, she transferred to the Clark County Sheriff's Office in Indiana and served as a correctional officer for two years.

Officer Ray left the Sheriff's Office in 2019 and became an officer with the Corrections Department of Indiana as well as a deputy sheriff in Bullitt County, KY. She is the only correctional officer to ever go undercover at a facility as an inmate and later return to work as an officer at the same location. Her story was profiled in the A & E program, 60 days, and she subsequently anchored her own spin-off show called *Inmate to Officer*. Soon after, she transitioned from active law enforcement to the private sector. Currently, Officer Ray is a state certified Addictions Recovery coach, working with probation and parole units to get treatment and sober living housing for those reentering freedom. She holds a B.A. in business, management, and marketing from Portland State University.
