

Judge Shanta Owens Jefferson County Circuit Court Birmingham, AL

Judge Shanta Owens began her legal career as a deputy district attorney for the Jefferson County District Attorney's Office in Alabama. In 2008, she was elected to Jefferson County District Court as a judge. She was the presiding judge for the Drug Court Program, which helps rehabilitate nonviolent drug offenders from 2009 to 2019. In 2019, Judge Owens was appointed to serve as a Circuit Court Judge for the 10th Judicial Circuit of Alabama.

Judge Owens holds a B.S. in computer information systems from Alabama State University and holds a dual J.D. and bachelor of civil law from Louisiana State University School of Law and Université D'Aix-Marseille III. She is a member of the National Association of Women Judges, Alabama Circuit Judges Association, Alabama State Bar Association, Birmingham Bar Association, and the Judicial Council of the Magic City Bar Association. In addition, she is the past President of the Board of Directors for the Addiction Prevention Coalition.
