Antoine Ensley began his law enforcement career in 1992 with the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department in the City of Charlotte, NC. He served for 12 years as a senior police officer, police field training officer, SWAT team crisis negotiator, background investigator, police sergeant, and supervisor-shift commander. In 2004, Ensley became Commander and Chief of Police of the Fletcher Police Department in Fletcher, NC.

In 2005, Ensley served as Superintendent for Juvenile Justice Programs for the City of Norfolk, VA where he championed reform strategies for youth confinement, mental health, and racial disparities. Ensley has passionately advocated for child welfare and raising the age a child can be prosecuted as an adult in criminal cases in North Carolina. He was appointed by the Board of County Commissioners to serve on the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council of Mecklenburg County.

Chief Ensley earned a B.S. in Criminal Justice from the University of North Carolina and a MBA from the Pfeiffer University. He is a graduate of the Municipal and County Administrator Program at UNC Chapel Hill and the FBI National Academy for Law Enforcement Executives. He resides partly in Johannesburg, South Africa and Charlotte, North Carolina.
