Chiraag Bains is a former federal prosecutor with the Department of Justice's Office of the Assistant Attorney General. As Senior Counsel to the Assistant Attorney General from 2014 to 2017, Bains helped lead the work on criminal justice reform; investigating constitutional policing; solitary confinement cases; fine, fee, and bail practices; and homelessness.

Bains is also a former Special Assistant U.S. Attorney in the District of Columbia U.S. Attorney's Office, Sex Offense and Domestic Violence Unit. In this unit, he was tasked with prosecuting misdemeanors up through the most serious felony sex offense cases.

Bains received his J.D. from Harvard Law School, where he was an Articles Editor on the Harvard Law Review and a Paul & Daisy Soros Fellow; his M.Phil. in Criminology from the University of Cambridge on a Gates Scholarship; and his B.A. from Yale College, where he was a Truman Scholar.

In 2015, Bains was given the highest award in the Department of Justice - the Attorney General's Award for Exceptional Service. He is currently a visiting senior fellow at Harvard Law School's Criminal Justice Policy Program.
