



Director Elliot T. Boyce, Sr. (Ret.) New York State Police - Employee Assistance Program Cicero, NY

Director Elliot Boyce (Ret.) began his law enforcement career in 1987 as a trooper with the New York State Police. In 1996, he was assigned to the Community Narcotics Enforcement Team, managing multi-level undercover narcotics investigations across the state.

During his over 35 years with the New York State Police he held various roles, including Hate/Bias Crimes Investigator, Crisis Negotiator, U.S. Customs Officer and Drug Enforcement Administration Task Force Officer. In 2015, he was appointed to Director of the Employee Assistance Program.

In 2005, Boyce returned to his alma mater, State University of New York at Oswego, as an adjunct professor where he developed and instructed the Multicultural Law Enforcement and Criminal Investigations courses. Boyce has served on the Executive Boards of the Syracuse Alumni Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., Syracuse – Onondaga County Chapter of the NAACP, Liberty Resources Board of Directors, Syracuse Area American Cancer Society Board Advisor, a Syracuse Educational Opportunity Center Advisory Council, Guardians Association of the New York State Troopers, National Black State Trooper Coalition, the National Association of Black Law Enforcement Officers and is a lifetime member of the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives.

A lifetime learner, he holds Bachelor of Science in Public Justice from the State University of New York at Oswego, a Master's in Criminal Justice from the School of Criminal Justice at the State University of New York at Albany and Diversity & Inclusion Certifications from Cornell University.
