Chief Bryan Zeringue is the current police chief of Thibodaux, Louisiana. In 1980, he began his law enforcement career with this department. In 1986, he transitioned to the Louisiana State Police and would go on to serve a total of 21 years as a sergeant and public information officer.

In 2011, Zeringue left the Louisiana State Police and went on to work for Louisiana Licensing Board for Contractors. In 2015, he

was unanimously confirmed by the Thibodaux City Council as Chief of Police. Under his leadership, the department has focused on juvenile justice and community policing programs to build better relationships with residents and better serve their needs.

In addition to his role as police chief, Zeringue is Chief of the Bayou Boeuf Volunteer Fire Department, Vice Chairman of the South Central Regional Safety Coalition, and a member of the Louisiana Association of Chiefs of Police. He is an avid drummer and resides in Thibodaux.
