Her duties involved responding to calls concerning shootings, domestic violence, child abuse, and prostitution. She also taught new recruits at the Police Academy and coordinated meetings with members of the community.

In 2009, Lowe became a patrol officer with the Clarkston Police Department in Georgia. She focused on providing resources to victims

of domestic violence, coordinated citizen safety classes for refugees, and created a Field Training Officer Guide. She is a P.O.S.T Certified Police Officer, National Passenger Safety Seat Technician, and has training in Crisis Intervention.

Lowe left policing in 2013 and has since worked in the private sector. As the parent of a child with epilepsy and mitochondrial disease, she works with numerous organizations and served as co-chair of the Dekalb Interagency Coordination Council (I.C.C.), board member for the Atlanta chapter of the United Mitochondrial Disease Foundation (U.M.D.F.), and speaker for Parent 2 Parent of Georgia. She resides in the Canton, Georgia, area.
