Donnie James began his law enforcement career in 1996 as an officer for the North Chicago Police Department. In 2002, he transferred to the DeKalb County Police Department in Georgia where he initially served as a patrol officer before becoming a detective in the Narcotics and South Property Crime units. In 2008, he was promoted to police sergeant and worked within the Robbery & Homicide unit of the Criminal Investigation Division. In 2013, he was appointed Lieutenant.

In 2017, James was elevated to his current position of Captain where he is responsible for overseeing the South and Tucker precincts. He is a Peace Officer's Standards and Training (P.O.S.T.) certified instructor and has received 14 commendations for his work in law enforcement. He holds a B.S. in criminal justice from Strayer University, a M.S. in criminal justice intelligence and crime analysis from Michigan State University, and is a graduate of both the Police Management program at the University of Louisville and the Police Training Institute (P.T.I.) at the University of Illinois. He is a member of the International Association of Chiefs of Police (I.A.C.P.) and the International Association of Law Enforcement Intelligence Analysts.
