Chief Edward C. Jackson **Annapolis Police Department** **Baltimore, MD**

Chief Edward C. Jackson served with the Baltimore Police Department for 21 years. He began as a foot patrolman and rose through the ranks to Colonel, finally retiring as Chief of the Administrative Division. Jackson participated in over 500 misdemeanor and felony arrests and investigated crimes including murder, rape, arson, drug distribution, assault, and child abuse.

Jackson served as an instructor at the Baltimore Police Academy where he taught criminal investigation, management and supervision, community relations, arrest procedures, and police ethics. He also received professional training in homeland security and violence intervention. In 2018, Colonel Jackson returned from retirement to become the Inspector General of the Baltimore Police.

In 2019, Jackson became Chief of the Annapolis Police Department. Prior to that position, he was an Assistant Professor of criminal justice at Baltimore City Community College. He holds a B.S. in criminal justice from Coppin State College, an M.S. in Applied Behavioral Sciences with a concentration in Community Development from Johns Hopkins University, and a Ph.D. in Public Safety Leadership from Capella University.
