Retired Judge George Eskin began his professional career as a prosecutor for Ventura County, California. He served as Assistant District Attorney in Santa Barbara County and as Chief Assistant City Attorney for Los Angeles from 1976 until 1981. He was a trial court judge in Santa Barbara for ten years and established a Military Veterans Treatment Court.

Judge Eskin was certified as a specialist in criminal law for 25 years by the State Bar Board of Legal Specialization. He's received numerous awards and commendations for his professional service and achievements, including the Ventura County District Attorney Woodruff J. Deem "Medal of Justice" Award, the Santa Barbara Bar Association John T. Rickard "Judicial Service" Award, the Richard Abbe "Humanitarian" Award, and the Santa Barbara Veterans Coordinating Council Veterans Service Award.

He served on the California Judicial Council Pretrial Detention Reform Workgroup, the Proposition 47 Executive Steering Committee to the California Board of State and Community Corrections, the Santa Barbara County Human Services Commission, the Anti-Defamation League Executive Committee, the Santa Barbara Jewish Federation Board of Directors, and the Shelter Services for Women Board of Directors.

Judge Eskin graduated from U.C.L.A. School of Law in 1965. He's married to California State Senator Hannah-Beth Jackson and has been the public address announcer for the U.C.S.B. women's basketball team since 1993. He has three children and six grandchildren.
