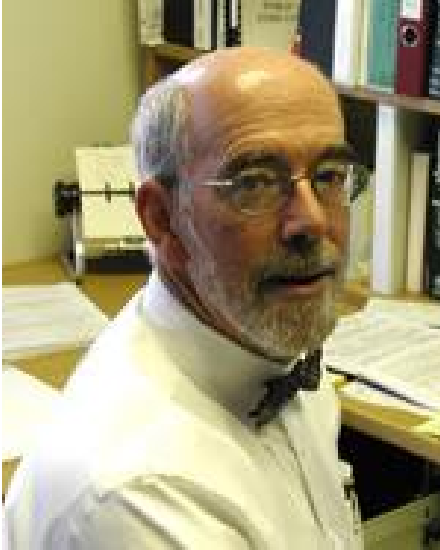

Jim Doherty has worked as a prosecutor and corrections officer in American Samoa. Prior to attending law school, he spent a year helping criminal defendants into drug and alcohol rehabilitation programs and spent a year as a cell block officer in a large county jail. He later gained experience working the other side of the justice system by serving as a public defender. In total, he has been practicing law for over 30 years, including several years as a felony public defender in Oregon, as a municipal prosecutor for several cities in Washington, and two years as the Chief Prosecutor in the Attorney General's Office in American Samoa.

He is part of the King County Bar Association Drug Policy Project, which was the country's first county-wide collaboration to examine and work toward alternatives to America's longest war. He is also a member of the Voluntary Committee of Lawyers.

Since 1993, Doherty has served as a full time legal consultant with Municipal Research & Services Center, a non-profit organization providing research assistance to cities and counties in the State of Washington.
