Deputy District Attorney Lisel Petis (Fmr.) 14th Judicial District Attorney's Office, Colorado Greenville, South Carolina

Lisel Petis began her career as a Deputy District Attorney in the Weld County's District Attorney's Office in 2012. During her time as a Deputy District Attorney, she participated in and litigated intimate partner violence and unlawful sexual contact cases. She also worked in the domestic violence courtroom for some time where she handled bond heardings, mandatory protection order hearings, and trials.

In 2014, Lisel Petis served as a Senior Deputy District Attorney with the 14th Judicial District Attorney's Office. As a Senior Deputy District Attorney, Petis was in charge of the felony docket which included domestic violence cases, sexual assault cases, and juvenile delinquency cases. She worked closely with survivors through the legal process.

Soon after, Deputy District Attorney Petis served as a council member for Steamboat Springs City Council. She led efforts for a local co-responder program with law enforcement and mental health professionals. She was also an Executive Director for a nonprofit, Advocates for Routt County, dedicated to diminishing violence and its impacts.

In 2012, Deputy District Attorney Petis received a JD from the University of Denver and became a licensed attorney in Colorado. Petis is an appointed member of the Pretrial Services Advisory Board for the 14th Judicial District.
