Chief Michael Botieri **Plymouth Police Department** **Plymouth, MA**

Chief Michael Botieri began his law enforcement career in 1985 as an officer with the Plymouth Police Department in Massachusetts. In 1989, he was elevated to the rank of sergeant and was assigned to the Patrol Division. In 1996, he became a captain and was assigned to the Administrative Division where he was responsible for oversight of the Training Division, Records Division, and all department auxiliary services. Starting in 1997, he simultaneously worked within the Operations and Administrative divisions. In 2000, he was promoted to the head of the Operations Division and his duties expanded to include oversight of the Uniformed Division, Detectives Division,

Prosecution Division, Safety Officer Office, the Harbormaster's Division, and all department dispatchers. In 2008, he was named to his current position as Chief of the Plymouth Police Department.

Chief Botieri's service has been notable for his commitment to combating the opioid epidemic, domestic violence, and sexual assault. He is a graduate of the 171st session of the FBI's National Academy as well as the FBI Law Enforcement Executive Development Program. He is a member of the New England Chapter of FBI National Academy Associates and served as President in 2013. He has taught criminal justice courses at Quincy College as an adjunct professor. In 2012, Governor Charles Baker appointed Botieri to the Municipal Police Training Committee (MPTC) to represent Southeastern Massachusetts police agencies. He holds a BA in sociology from Southeastern Massachusetts University and a MA in Criminal Justice from Anna Maria College.
