Detective Corinne N. Mason Bergen County Prosecutor's Office, New Jersey Board Member

Detective Corinne N. Mason began her law enforcement career in 2007 with the New Jersey Department of Corrections and in 2008 she transitioned to the Camden County Sheriff's Office. In 2013, she began working with the Federal Bureau of Investigations as a South Jersey Violent Offender and Gang Task Force Investigator. In 2014, she was promoted to Sergeant. In that position, she also served as Commander of Internal Affairs and Crisis & Hostage Negotiator. In 2020, she began her current role as a Detective for the Bergen County Prosecutor's Office, where she was assigned to the Special Victim's Unit until 2022, when she transitioned to the Trial Section and the Bias Unit. Detective Mason is also currently a Police Academy Instructor in Bergen County.

Detective Mason's professional service, teaching, and community service have earned her a multitude of awards and recognitions, including the Change Makers Torch Award in 2016, the Cherry Hill Chapter's Gold Star Award in 2017, and the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement (NOBLE) Executives Shining Star Award in 2021. Additionally, in 2023 she received the International Council of Women in Law Enforcement's Survivor's Award and a letter of recognition from New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy for efforts in Criminal Justice Reform and peer training throughout the state.

Detective Mason currently sits on the Executive Board of the New Jersey Chapter of the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE). She is also an active member of the International Council of Women in Law Enforcement and is a Special Advisor to the NY Metro Chapter of the National Black MBA Association.

Mason received her Bachelor of Arts in Public Service Administration from Fairleigh Dickinson University, and her Master's in Human Services from Lincoln University. She is currently an Adjunct Professor at Long Island University and teaches a course on assessing and helping law enforcement from a mental health perspective.
