

Sergeant James Scott (Ret.) Connecticut State Police New Haven, CT

Sergeant James Scott began his law enforcement career in 1996 as a New York City Corrections Officer. In 1998, he transitioned to the Connecticut State Police as a Patrol Trooper. In 2014, he was promoted to Sergeant, where he also served as Shift Commander, supervising criminal and accident investigations in an area encompassing six towns and 80 miles of state highway. In 2016, Sergeant Scott became the Commanding Officer of the Recruiting Unit, and served in this role until his retirement in 2019.

During his law enforcement career, Sergeant Scott simultaneously served in the Army National Guard. He is a Veteran of Operation Iraqi Freedom and after 20 years of military service, he retired with the rank of Master Sergeant.

Sergeant Scott is the recipient of the Connecticut State Police Bravery Medal and the Community Policing Award from the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Connecticut. Additionally, he is an instructor and board member for the Connecticut Alliance to Benefit Law Enforcement (CABLE).

Upon retiring from the Connecticut State Police, Sergeant Scott assumed a full-time faculty position at Albertus Magnus College in New Haven, Connecticut, where he currently serves as an Associate Professor in the Criminal Justice Department.
