Assistant State's Attorney Ramon de la Cabada (Fmr.) 20th Judicial District of Florida Miami, FL

Ramon de la Cabada began his career as an Assistant State Attorney with the 20th Judicial District of Florida in 1991. In 1995, he began serving as an Assistant Statewide Prosecutor for the Office of Statewide Prosecution (OSWP) within the Office of the Attorney General. In this role, he prosecuted multi-circuit crimes and empaneled grand juries that issued reports that changed laws to better protect Medicaid users against fraud.

In 1999, de la Cabada started his own law firm, focusing on criminal and regulatory law. He has been practicing law for more than 34 years. Ramon de la Cabada has taught courses for several law enforcement agencies. He was also hired by the IRS to help rewrite money laundering laws in the Dominican Republic and by the Organization of American States to train prosecutors on corruption cases. He has instructed prosecutors and defense attorneys on jury trials, advanced trial and litigation, and anti-corruption in various Latin American countries.

Ramon de la Cabada received a JD from Florida State University's College of Law and now teaches there. He is the treasurer of the Executive Committee for the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers (NACDL). At NACDL, he has chaired or co-chaired committees and task forces dealing with the Trial Penalty, Criminalization of Voting Rights, Fact Finding Mission in Puerto Rico to assist in criminal justice issues, and Foreign Training. De la Cabada is a life member of the Florida Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers.
