Judge Ronald Reinstein (Ret.) Superior Court of Arizona Maricopa County, AZ

Judge Ronald Reinstein began his legal career in 1974 as a Maricopa County Deputy Attorney, leading the Sex Crimes Unit and the Criminal Trial Unit. In 1985, he was appointed to the bench of the Superior Court of Arizona. In 1990, he became the Presiding Criminal Judge, and was responsible for trying major crimes cases and overseeing multiple specialized courts. This included the Initial Appearance Court, Early Disposition Court, Drug Court, D.U.I. Court, Veterans Court, and the Comprehensive Mental Health Court. In 1998, he became the Associate Presiding Judge of the court.

In 2007, Judge Reinstein retired from the Superior Court of Arizona. He was appointed by the Chief Justice to serve as the Director of the Center for Evidence Based Sentencing and currently works as a judicial consultant for the Arizona Supreme Court. Judge Reinstein is the Chair of the Supreme Court Capital Case Oversight Committee, the Commission on Victims in the Courts, and the Arizona Forensic Science Advisory Committee. He was appointed by Attorney General Janet Reno to the National Commission on the Future of DNA Evidence, where he served as Chair of the Post Conviction Issues Committee. He is a member of the Legal Resources Task Group and the CSI Subcommittee for the Organization of Scientific Area Committees. He also serves as a board member for Justice System Partners and the Justice Management Institute. Reinstein was a faculty member of the National Judicial Education Program for Adult Victim Sexual Assault Cases. He has been inducted into the Maricopa County Bar Association Hall of Fame and was honored by the U.S. Office for Victims of Crimes with their Distinguished Service Award. He holds a B.A. and J.D. from Indiana University, and was inducted into the School of Law's Academy of Law Alumni Fellows. Reinstein also was named a Distinguished Fellow of the Morrison Institute of Public Policy at Arizona State University.
