Peter Moskos was a Baltimore City Police officer assigned to patrol on the midnight shift in the high-crime Eastern District, an area known to many from the H.B.O. series The Wire.

Moskos left Baltimore in 2001 to return to his graduate studies in sociology at Harvard University. Since 2004, he has been a professor of Law, Police Science, and Criminal Justice Administration at John Jay College of Criminal Justice in New York City.

Moskos is the author of four books: *Cop in the Hood* (Princeton University Press), about policing in Baltimore and the war on drugs, *In Defense of Flogging* (Basic Books), about incarceration and punishment, *Greek Americans* (Transaction Publishers), about the immigrant experience, and, most recently, *Back from the Brink* (Oxford University Press), the true story about New York City's extraordinary 1990s crime drop.
